Considered "one of the finest actresses of her generation" by The New York Times, Alba Rohrwacher is an internationally renowned Italian actress. Born in Florence, Rohrwacher has a German father and an Italian mother. She studied acting at the Centro Sperimentale di Cinematografia in Rome and immediately gained recognition for her award-winning collaborations with Luca Guadagnino ("I Am Love," "Part Deux"), Marco Bellocchio ("Dormant Beauty," "Blood of My Blood"), Laura Bispuri ("Sworn Virgin," "Daughter of Mine," "The Peacock's Paradise"), Saverio Costanzo ("Hungry Hearts," "The Solitude of Prime Numbers"), her sister Alice Rohrwacher ("Happy as Lazzaro") Nanni Moretti ("Thee Floors Up"), Maggie Gyllenhaal ("The Lost Daughter") and Jasmine Trinca ("Marcel!"). She was also the narrator of "The Brilliant Friend," a RAI TV series. Among her numerous competitive awards, she has won the Volpi Cup for Best Actress, two David di Donatello Awards for Best Actress, and two Italian Critics' Awards, the Nastro d'Argento.
