No stranger to Broadway, Clark is well-known for his role as George Washington in "Hamilton" and as Marvin Gaye in "Marvin Gaye In Motown: The Musical." His additional theater credits include "Fences," "Immediate Family" and the "Sophisticated Ladies and His Girl Friday."

In addition to performing, Clark is a songwriter and producer. He has performed with many artists, including Maxwell, Brandy, Ne-Yo, Anita Baker and Michael Bublé. He was a co-writer on Mary J. Blidge's "Irreversible" on the album "My Life II."

In addition to performing, Clark co-founded inDEFINED, an initiative that inspires and teaches young people to use their voices to erase constrictive labels in our society. He created the production company Artists Park Productions and has won many awards, such as the 2018 Voice for Social Justice Award from Rutgers University and the 2019 Gallery of Success Award from Temple University.

Clark graduated from the Yale School of Drama and Temple University and currently lives in Los Angeles, California.
