

Danny Jacob Composer and Song Producer

Emmy® Award-nominated Danny Jacob is composer and song producer of Disney+'s original animated adventure movie "Phineas and Ferb The Movie: Candace Against the Universe." The movie follows stepbrothers Phineas and Ferb as they set out across the galaxy to rescue older sister Candace, who has been abducted by aliens and finds utopia in a far-off planet, free of pesky little brothers.

Jacob was previously composer and song producer for Disney's five-time Emmy® Award-winning series "Phineas and Ferb," for which he earned three Emmy® Award nominations, and Disney's Emmy® Award-nominated series "Milo Murphy's Law."

His additional television song producing credits include "Sofia the First," "Elena of Avalor," "Rapunzel's Tangled Adventure" and "Kim Possible." He also wrote main title songs for "Jackie Chan's Adventures," Disney Channel's "Lilo and Stitch" and "The Emperor's New School."

Inspired by Jimmy Page and Led Zeppelin, Jacob's musical style span the roots of rock and R&B to classical and beyond the edge of contemporary. He first picked up the guitar when he was 13-years-old, and formed his own band by the time he was 15. Soon, major recording artists including Tower of Power, Chaka Kahn, Bette Midler and George Michael hired him as their featured guitarist for worldwide tours.

Jacobs later went on to collaborate with Hans Zimmer on Elton John's "Road to El Dorado." This led to his work as a featured guitarist with the score composers Harry Gregson-Williams and John Powell on the Academy Award®-winning film "Shrek," where he also arranged and co-produced Eddie Murphy's cover of "I'm A Believer" from the multiplatinum soundtrack album. He also performed on projects including the Emmy Award-winning "Bette Midler in Concert: Diva Las Vegas" and the GRAMMY Award®-winning song "Heaven Help Us" by Ray Charles with Gladys Knight.

As a patron of the arts, Jacob and his longtime partner, GRAMMY Award-nominated film music producer Marylata Elton, established an endowment for the Teenage Drama Workshop, the nation's longest running youth theater arts program at California State University, Northridge. Born and raised in Southern California, Jacob currently resides in Los Angeles.
