David Light and Joseph Raso first teamed up as writing partners in Columbia University's Graduate Film Division. They have since created various projects for NBC, SONY, ABC, Nickelodeon, Disney Plus, Disney Channel.

Their music-driven comedy pilot "Zombies & Cheerleaders," which they produced and wrote, became the springboard for the Disney Channel Original Movie "Disney's Zombies." Their "Zombies" teleplay was nominated for a Humanitas Prize, an award honoring film and television writers whose work inspires compassion, hope and understanding. After the huge success of "Zombies" the pair returned to write and executive produce the highly anticipated sequels, "Disney's Zombies 2" and "Disney's Zombies 3." The duo were also writers on this year's acclaimed Disney Plus film "Sneakerella."

Light was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and graduated from Cheltenham High School and then Columbia University. After college, he animated on the feature film "Cats Don't Dance" before working at Nickelodeon and MTV Animation as a development executive. He currently resides in Los Angeles with his wife and three children.

Raso was born and raised in Toronto, Canada. He is a graduate of McGill University and attended film school at Columbia University in New York City. He is the writer and director of several award-winning shorts and the creator and executive producer of the series "Seed," and the co-writer and executive producer of the Netflix film "Awake."
