Zach Woodlee is the choreographer for "High School Musical: The Musical: The Series," a reinvented take on the two-time Emmy® Award-winning "High School Musical" franchise, for Disney+.

Most notably, Woodlee was the choreographer for the Emmy award winning series "Glee," where he also served as a producer for five seasons. Woodlee also choreographed and coproduced Fox's live event special "Grease Live." His other television credits include "The Glee Project," "How I Met Your Mother 100th Episode," "Eli Stone," "Supergirl" and "Bones."

In addition to his television success, Woodlee has choreographed for numerous box-office hits including "Glee: The 3D Concert Movie," "27 Dresses," "Eat Pray Love," "Dumplin" and "Love, Simon." He has also contributed to "Hairspray," "Step Up," and "17 Again."
