Julie Gardner Executive Producer

Award-winning television producer Julie Gardner is an executive producer for season two of "Doctor Who."

Gardner co-founded the production company Bad Wolf with Jane Tranter in 2015 after working together at BBC and BBC Worldwide Productions.

Gardner has previously served as BBC's head of Drama at BBC Wales where she led an award-winning slate of independent programming, including "The Girl in the Café," "Life on Mars," "Being Human" and "Stuart: A Life Backwards." At BBC Worldwide Productions, Gardner executive produced titles such as "Da Vinci's Demons" and "Getting On."

Since launching Bad Wolf, Gardner has executive produced titles that include "I Hate Suzie," "I Hate Suzie Too," "The Winter King," and "Red Eye." In the U.S., Gardner launched the sister company Bad Wolf America, through which she has executive produced the limited series "Lady in the Lake."

Gardner is an honorary fellow of the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama and the University of West Glamorgan. She is the recipient of the Sian Phillips Award at BAFTA Cymru 2013. In 2014, she was made an MBE for her contribution to the growth of the television industry in Wales. Most recently, she has received the 2024 BAFTA Cymru Outstanding Contribution to Television Award.
