



Justin Long **"Mr. Bratt"**

Actor, writer, director, producer and humorist Justin Long stars as Mr. Bratt in the chilling new series "Goosebumps," inspired by R.L. Stine's worldwide bestselling books, premiering on Disney+ and Hulu.

Long was most recently seen in 20th Century Studios' wildly successful "Barbarian," alongside Bill Skarsgård and Georgina Campbell.

In 2021, Long made his directorial debut with the comedy "Lady of the Manor." He wrote, directed and produced the film with his brother Christian. He also starred in the film opposite Melanie Lynskey, Judy Greer and Ryan Phillippe. He recently portrayed the founder of BuzzFeed in the supernatural thriller "Dear David" and was the lead, opposite Alex Moffat, in "Christmas with the Campbells."

Long got his start with movie roles in "Galaxy Quest" and "Jeepers Creepers." He then shifted to the small screen on the series "Ed" and enjoyed his first box-office success in the offbeat comedy "Dodgeball." Later comedic roles include "Accepted," "The Break Up" (opposite Vince Vaughn and Jennifer Aniston), and the Adam Sandler-produced "Strange Wilderness" with Steve Zahn. Long starred in, wrote and produced the 2013 feature "A Case of You" alongside Vince Vaughn, Sam Rockwell, Evan Rachel Wood and Brendan Fraser.

Additional film credits include "The Wave" (opposite Donald Faison), "After Class," "Live Free or Die Hard" (opposite Bruce Willis), "He's Just Not That Into You," "Zack and Miri Make a Porno," the lead role opposite Alison Lohman in Sam Raimi's "Drag Me to Hell," "Funny People," "And Then I Go," "Literally, Right Before Aaron," "Comet," "Ghost Team," "Frank & Lola" and "Serious Moonlight." He can also be seen in "Jay and Silent Bob Reboot." Additionally, Long lent his voice to 2015's "Alvin and the Chipmunks: The Road Chip" and the independent feature "Tall Tales from the Magical Garden of Antoon Krings."

In Long's recent television roles, he can be seen in the drama "Giri/Haji," created and written by BAFTA Award nominee Joe Barton and directed by BAFTA Award winner and Emmy® Award nominee Julian Farino. In July 2021, he lent his voice to "Masters of the Universe: Revelation."

He currently hosts his podcast, "Life is Short with Justin Long," alongside his brother Christian.
