Nam can be seen in Ava Duvernay’s feature film “Origin” which was nominated for the Best Film category at Venice Film Fest ‘23. Most recently, he can be seen starring in the Disney+ hit “Descendants: The Rise Of Red,” which premiered on July 12th.
