As a Wardrobe Maintenance Assistant, you'll report to the Head and Deputy Head of Wardrobe. Your focus will be on the preparation, maintenance, and continuity of costumes for the cast.

Responsibilities and Duties

- Prepare, repair, clean and maintain costumes to ensure that they are performance-ready for every show.
- Assist the Head of Wardrobe on any day-to-day changes that might impact the running of the Production and ensure clear communication with the department.
- Ensure awareness of understudy and swing performances ahead of each show and make necessary adjustments.
- Assist with costume fittings when required to do so.
- Attend rehearsal, technical, dress and understudy rehearsals as required.
- Responsible for repairing costumes as instructed and upholding the show's quality in accordance with artistic standards, under the direction of the Head and Deputy Head of Wardrobe, Production Manager, and Resident Creative Team.
- Report and feedback show and staff-related issues in a timely manner.
- Acquire familiarity with all plots/tracks within the Wardrobe department.
- Work in full compliance with Disney's Health and Safety Policy and maintain knowledge of relevant legislation and best practices
