Shannon Lucio plays 'Louise Shepard' in National Geographic's original scripted series THE RIGHT STUFF on Disney+, based on Tom Wolfe's bestselling nonfiction series, which dramatically explores the early days of the NASA space program.

Shannon received her Bachelor of Arts degree in theater from the University of Southern California. Shortly thereafter, she landed her breakout role on "The O.C." Her notable television credits include "Roots," "American Horror Story," "Prison Break," "True Blood," "Agents of S.H.I.E.L.D.," and "Grey's Anatomy."

Some of her noteworthy films are "Grounded," opposite Aaron Paul and Lena Olin; "Fireflies in the Garden" with Julia Roberts and Ryan Reynolds; and "Feast of Love," directed by Robert Benton.

A founding member of production company Filament Features, Shannon is involved in all aspects of production, simultaneously acting in, writing and producing many of Filament's projects. She is also a member of Hero Theatre. Her recent theater credits include Alma in "The Eccentricities of a Nightingale" (Pasadena Playhouse), Mae in "Mud" (Rosenthal Theater) and Florrie in "Waiting for Lefty" (Rosenthal Theater). Shannon originated the role of 'Jen' in "The Cake," opposite Carolyn Ratteray at The Echo Theatre, and she reprised her role in the show's run at The Geffen Playhouse.
