



Eric Judor is half of the comedy duo Eric and Ramzy, which he founded with Ramzy Bedia in 1994. Known for their dark and offbeat humor, the two became a huge hit on stage, on the radio, and on television two years later, with the series H, starring Djamel Debbouze. Starting in 2000, they starred in a string of films, such as the box office hit La Tour Montparnasse infernale, Gérard Pirès' French Spies, and Philippe Haïm's Lucky Luke and the Daltons, where Eric perfected his "big-hearted idiot" persona. After dubbing work on several movies, the duo created an animated series, Moot-Moot, and co-authored the quirky 2 Alone in Paris (2007), which they also co-directed. That same year, they starred in Quentin Dupieux's Steak.

Alongside his work with Ramzy, Eric wrote and directed the series *Platane* for Canal+, and starred in a number of films, including Quentin Dupieux's Wrong Cops, Arthur Benzaquen's *The New Adventures of Aladdin*, Julien Guetta's *The Troubleshooter*, and Lionel Steketee's *Aladdin* 2. He also directed the films *La Tour 2 contrôle infernale* (2016) and *Problemos* (2017). In 2019, he voiced Mr. Link in Metropolitan's animated feature *Missing Link*, and directed the third season of *Platane*. The following year, he starred in Jean-Pascal Zadi's *Simply Black* and was a guest on season 2 of Zadi's *Carrément craignos*. In 2021, he starred in the Netflix comedy *The Last Mercenary*.
